

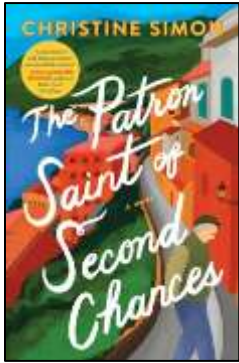

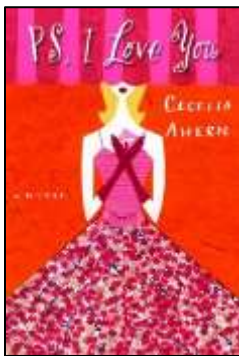
The Patron Saint of Second Chances

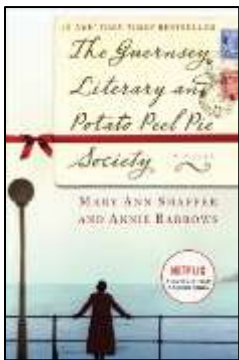


PS, I Love You
