When Juniper learns that Gabe's about to inherit the farm, she worries that he'll sell it. She comes up with a plan to get close to him and stop that from happening. At first, Juniper and Gabe couldn't be more at odds, but the more time they spend with each other, the more they grow to like each other. Can they set aside their differences to do what's best for the farm—and each other?

Discussion Questions

- The book is written in alternating chapters from Gabe's and Juniper's perspectives. Why do you think the author chose to use a dual point of view?
- Both Juniper and Gabe try to live up to family expectations. In what ways does this hold them back? In what ways does it guide their paths? How do the experiences of their parents influence their choices?
- The title of the book comes from a song by Chris Cornell. At what point do Juniper and Gabe come to their respective bends in the road?
- The book takes place on a farm in northern Minnesota, and the farm is a key element in the plot. How does the setting play a role in the story?
- Talk about the element of mental health in the book. Some ideas to start: Gabe's panic attacks and his resistance to the idea of seeing a therapist, his parents' history of addiction, Juniper's grief after her dad's death.




Activities

Scan the QR code for a Spotify playlist put together by the author of all the songs mentioned in the book, either outright or woven into the narrative.


